Secretarial report of the January GA of the K.N.P.S.V. Held on the 25th of January 2020 in Utrecht

During the General Assembly, the 118th candidate board of the K.N.P.S.V. was revealed. The 118th candidate board consists of Ulrike van Ark, Emma van Rijn, Henrik Huizinga and Katie Remmers. The candidate treasurer will be announced at a later moment via social media.

The board has proposed seven propositions. All propositions have been accepted. The first five propositions regarded the list of decisions. The decision regarding the archive has lapsed, as the Noord-Hollands Archief finished repacking the archive. The second proposition regarded an amendment in the decision regarding the Folia Pharmaceutica. As of the academic year of 2020-2021, four, instead of five, editions of the Folia Pharmaceutica will be published yearly. The third proposition concerned the decision regarding the Personal Development Day (PDD). The decision has been taken of the list, as the PDD has been suspended starting the academic year of 2020-2021. The fourth proposition regarded an amendment in the decision concerning the Toekomst- en OpleidingsPerspectieven (TOP-)Committee. The TOP-Committee will be installed once and will consist of five people, among which one member of the board. This change was made following the abolition of the PDD. The fifth proposal concerned an amendment to the decision regarding the transactional costs for European Pharmaceutical Students' Association (EPSA) and International Pharmaceutical Students' Federation (IPSF) conferences. The joint payment protocol will be complied with, starting the 25th of January 2020.

The sixth proposal concerned the social project. The K.N.P.S.V. will contribute to the promotion and selection for an annual social project, in collaboration with Farmacie Mondiaal, in Rwanda for master pharmacy students. The participating students will receive compensation from Farmacie Mondiaal.

The seventh proposal concerned the Professions' Day Committee. The Professions' Day Committee will from now on be interurban. At least two members of the committee will come from Utrecht.

The administrative policy memorandum was evaluated during the January GA 2020. The half-yearly financial report has been presented and approved.

The foreign commissioner has provided an update on the NK consultation, the PDD, the snuffelstages (one-day internships), the Student Exchange Program (SEP), the IPSF World Congress 2020, the joint payment protocol, and the social project. Fourteen Dutch students have started their application for a SEP internship, ten of which are almost finished. There are already 45 students interested in coming to the Netherlands for a SEP internship. In addition, registrations for the IPSF World Congress 2020 in Seoul, South Korea are open.

The commissioner of general affairs has given an update on EPSA, the lunch lectures, the TWIN, the Stipendia Fund, the Individual Mobility Project and the promotion. The EPSA Autumn Assembly has taken place in Poreč, Croatia. In the meantime, twelve people have registered for the EPSA Annual Congress from the 20th till the 26th of April 2020 in Lyon, France. A meeting of the Stipendia Fund took place in October. The six light applications submitted were approved and two of the five heavy applications submitted were approved.

The Professions Day Committee 2020-2022, the International Committee 2020-2021 and two members of the SEP working group have been installed. The International Committee 2019-2020 and two members of the SEP working group have been discharged. Unfortunately, it has recently become more difficult to find enthusiastic members who want to take place in a committee. As a result, there are still a few vacancies open for various committees.

Finally, the Sports Committee "SpocoLoco" 2019-2020 has unveiled their logo and clothing.
